I gotta be real and honest with you. I'm sick of the cold weather. Generally speaking as a...uh...."healthy" man, I like the cold weather. Summer is just so hot! And I'm soum.....well..."fluffy." So usually, I'm not that energetic about the beginning of spring. I really like winter. The early nights. The holidays. Snowball fights, sledding, snow cream. I love winter! Spring just means the end of all that. But this year I'm tired of it and I'm ready for it to go away. And I'm really tired of the threat of snow. I think my family is too. Usually when there are flurries Martha will come run and tell me "It's snowing!! It's snowing!!" The kids are usually excited about missing a day of school. But Rebekah even made a comment last week about how she was tired of the snow. Maybe that's why I'm looking so forward to spring this year. Tired of the dark, dreary days. Tired of the trees looking dead. Oh to be sure, Spring has teased us. We've had a few days in the 70s followed by more sub-freezing temps and snow. I'm just tired of it. I'm ready for Spring to spring already! But there's another reason why I'm look-

ing forward to spring this year, and it doesn't have anything to do with the weather. Not really anyway. If you were to ask most people why they like spring, or why some say it's their favorite season. They would list some of the same reasons I did. The cold nights, the dreary days, the dead foliage. Recently, on Wednesday night we took a look at Ecclesiastes which contains the poem on "seasons" made famous in the 60s by The Byrds. There is something cyclical about the seasons and there is something cyclical about our own spiritual lives as well. There are times when our relationship with God and others are at a high, let's call that summer. We're on fire for God. Our church is growing, our private times special. When we can see and feel God moving all around us. But then something within us begins to cool. We start to drift aimlessly. Disappointments set in. And before we know it, we're in a full-fledged spiritual winter. If we're not careful, we can find ourselves clinging to this winter. We hide inside ourselves from God and from others. Everyone and everything starts to feel distant. I don't know if it's what psychologists would call depression, but I can't imagine that it would be much different.

Isn't it great that our Savior and King does not leave us floundering in spiritual winter! Isn't it great that He can bring spiritual revival to our hearts! *AND* when He brings revival to us, it overflows from us into others. Before we know it our church has thawed from its spiritual winter too. Are you ready for Spring? Are you ready for Revival? I know I am.




