Christmas is also a time for us to remember with wonder the miracle of the incarnation. John tells us, "And the Word became flesh and dwelt among us, and we have seen his glory, glory as of the only Son from the Father, full of grace and truth" (Jn. 1:14). Wow!

When we think of Christmas, we think of Lottie Moon. She was born to a family of privilege in Antebellum, Virginia. She was given educational opportunities far beyond most girls of her era. Her family owned Thomas Jefferson's home, Monticello, for a time. She was a member of the first group of southern women to receive a Master of Arts degree. Miss Moon was unsettled about the direction of her life. She felt a sense of special calling from God to become a bearer of glad tidings afar. But Southern Baptist at that time would not appoint unmarried women to serve as foreign missionaries. She found a temporary answer by establishing a successful school for girls in Cartersville, Georgia. She gave generous sums to the Foreign Mission Board for the support of missions in China and Italy. In due time, she was allowed to become a Southern Baptist Foreign missionary and sailed to China in 1873. In all, she served from 1873 until 1912 -39 years. She visited the United States only three times during this period. She died on Christmas Eve 1912, a year of famine, revolution, and inflation in China, and a year of declining funds for the Foreign Mission Board. She would do without food so the Chinese children could eat and at the time of her death weighed only 50 lbs. In the next year, the Christmas offering was taken with firm commitment to pay off the embarrassing debt on foreign missions. Since that time, Southern Baptists have taken an offering in December for foreign missions in honor of Miss Lottie Moon.
