I have come to the conclusion that we as a people are a fickle nation. We can't ever decide what we want. We spend the whole summer complaining about the heat, only to complain about the cold weather when it arrives. Or better yet, like this year, we'll complain about 90 degree days in October, forgetting that we had several days in the 70s in July and August.

Or consider this. Many of us bemoan the growth of box stores like Walmart or lament the loss of textile and furniture industries to overseas. We want to "buy local" and "buy American." The only problem with this is that most of us don't want to pay the prices that American and local retailers charge. We want to be paid \$20 an hour to make a \$10 pair of jeans. The fact of the matter is, overseas production is cheaper for companies (and no I'm not ignoring the multi-million dollar bonuses that are given either). But we have to either have to pay up for the "higher quality" American product or settle for the "lower quality" overseas or big box product. We can't have it both ways.

Another phenomenon I've been watching is the prognosticators of pay TV (what many of us would call cable). For decades, people have been clamoring for ala carte TV. Where you would just be able to get the channels you want without having to pay for the channels you don't. Well, for the first time more ala carte options are available, and more are coming. Companies like Netflix and Hulu have changed the TV market, by allowing customers to just "stream" the shows through the World Wide Web. And companies like Universal and Disney are supposed to be launching their own services very soon. My prediction is that in another ten years most of the major entertainment companies will have their own streaming services where they will house their own content. More money for them, more ala carte options for us. You'd think such a thing would be received as great news, wouldn't you? Nope. There are stories all

over the internet about how we're the real loser of the "streaming wars," that all these companies are selfish and greedy because they won't share their intellectual property, that in the long run the customer will be paying more for less. Are they right? I don't know. But I do know this...You just can't seem to make us happy. We're like Goldilocks except nothing is ever "just right." We are fickle people living in fickle times. But I think I know why.

Sometimes I wonder what God thinks when He looks down on us. We have all of these advances, all these advantages that we have living in this day and all we can do is complain. When I think about all the hardships that the settlers endured, that my grandparents and parents endured; and my household is upset because we might not get to see Live PD or Good Eats anymore! But I think I know the secret as to why there is all this unsettledness in our world. It's because we aren't thankful for what we have. Remember, back in the day, when you did someone a favor and they told you that they were "eternally grateful?" Well, now a days, we're eternally ungrateful! We have forgotten how to focus on the things we have, and instead center our attention on the things we don't have. Instead of counting our blessings, we're counting our perceived misfortunes.

In Paul's closing words to the Philippians he gives them the secret to happiness. He tells them to be content. And though it's not stated, be thankful to the Lord regardless of his circumstances. Which I believe is the heart of the Thanksgiving holiday.

I don't say this out of need, for I have learned to be content in whatever circumstances I find myself. I know both how to make do with little, and I know how to make do with a lot. In any and all circumstances I have learned the secret of being content—whether well fed or hungry, whether in abundance or in need. I am able to do all things through Him who strengthens me. Philippians 4:11-13
